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## Townhouse Tenants-Heat

It's hard to believe that Winter is here! Turn off outside water and keep your unit heated!

The team at DRNPHC is geared up for the Winter season and the cooler temperatures outside means it's time to heat the inside.

It's tough to predict how the outside temperatures may drop. If there is not enough heat in your unit the pipes may freeze and eventually burst, flooding your unit and potentially other units as well.

Cost incurred for restoration will be at the expense of the tenant if it is found that the cause for the burst pipe is due to lack of heat in the unit.

Should you be away from your unit, please ensure to:

- Have someone check up on the unit every day.
- Ensure the heat remains on and at an adequate temperature in the unit (taking into consideration the outside temperature).

Following these tips will help you avoid unexpected expenses caused by burst pipes, providing you with peace of mind to fully enjoy the winter months.

## 2021 Rent Freeze

The Government of Ontario has passed legislation to freeze 2021 rent at 2020 levels. This means that rents will not increase in 2021 for occupied units covered under the Residential Tenancies Act. The rent freeze will impact both Market and RGI units at DRNPHC.

# RGI Simplification

The Housing Services Act has changed to simplify how Rent-Geared-To-Income is calculated. Since July 2020, there is a change in the way rent is calculated. ff. Notices have been sent to RGI tenants to explain the changes and anticipate that this will be a welcome change to the process.

Some of the changes include:

- Your rent will be based on your income from your last Income Tax Return.
- Your rent will normally only change once a year after your Annual RGI Review.
- You will only have to tell us about <u>certain</u> changes to your income between Annual RGI Reviews.

You will need to file your income taxes every year. When we do your Annual RGI Review, you will need to give us a copy of your Proof of Income Statement from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). The Proof of Income Statement is a simple version of your tax assessment that summarizes your income and deductions for the tax year.

You do not need to give us your Proof of Income Statement until your first Annual RGI Review after July 1, 2020.

### Hot Chocolate "Bomb" DIY

Have you seen hot chocolate bombs and wonder how you can make them yourself? Don't have the molds at home? Take a look at this simple and easy idea and enjoy for a fraction of the cost!

#### What you need:

- Kinder Surprise/hollow chocolate "egg"
- Marshmallows/your choice of fillings
- Hot chocolate mix

#### Steps:

Carefully, break the chocolate egg into two as shown below.

Fill with hot chocolate mix, marshmallows and any other fillings.

Run some warm water on a plate or other flat surface and dry immediately. While still warm, melt the edges of the chocolate egg and place it back together.

Leave for a few minutes to allow for the chocolate to set.

Place in a mug and pour warm milk over to melt the egg.
